FACT SHEET

RSVP demonstrates the positive impact that older adults are making in their communities.

- Nationally, over 480,000 RSVP Volunteers provide assistance to an estimated 65,000 organizations.
- Locally, **444** RSVP Volunteers provided **91,177** hours of support to **36** community organizations in 2005.
 - RSVP Volunteers register their service with Senior Connections, The Capital Area Agency on Aging which serves the City of Richmond and the Counties of Charles City, Chesterfield, Goochland, Hanover, Henrico, New Kent, and Powhatan.
 - RSVP Volunteers are dedicated to helping others. New volunteers are always welcome.
 - Individuals age **55** and older can become a RSVP Volunteer. Some of our volunteers are in their 90's!
 - RSVP Volunteers choose to serve where they feel their talents will be the most beneficial. Volunteer placement assistance is also available.
 - RSVP Volunteers donate their time based on their availability and the needs of the organization. Volunteer service can range from a few hours to approximately 200 hours per month.
 - While in service, RSVP Volunteers receive free supplemental accident and liability coverage, *RSVP Greetings*, a quarterly newsletter and are recognized for their dedication and service during an annual event. Dependent on the availability of funds, limited travel reimbursement is available to volunteers needing financial assistance getting to and from their volunteer location.
